

Arizona Transportation Priorities and Funding Survey Results

As part of the 2015 Conference on Roads and Streets, participants used an online engagement tool, MetroQuest, to provide their opinions about the future of transportation in Arizona. The survey included questions about Arizona's priorities, how new transportation dollars should be spent and willingness to pay higher taxes for infrastructure. Preliminary results were presented during the opening session and a kiosk was located in the GCI booth where people could participate during the conference. People also participated by using the kiosk the ADOT/AzTA annual conference.

The survey was designed for "transportation insiders" and results have been shared with the business community and other organizations seeking to improve Arizona's infrastructure. In addition to conference participants several transportation organizations forwarded the survey link to their membership. 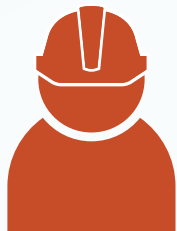

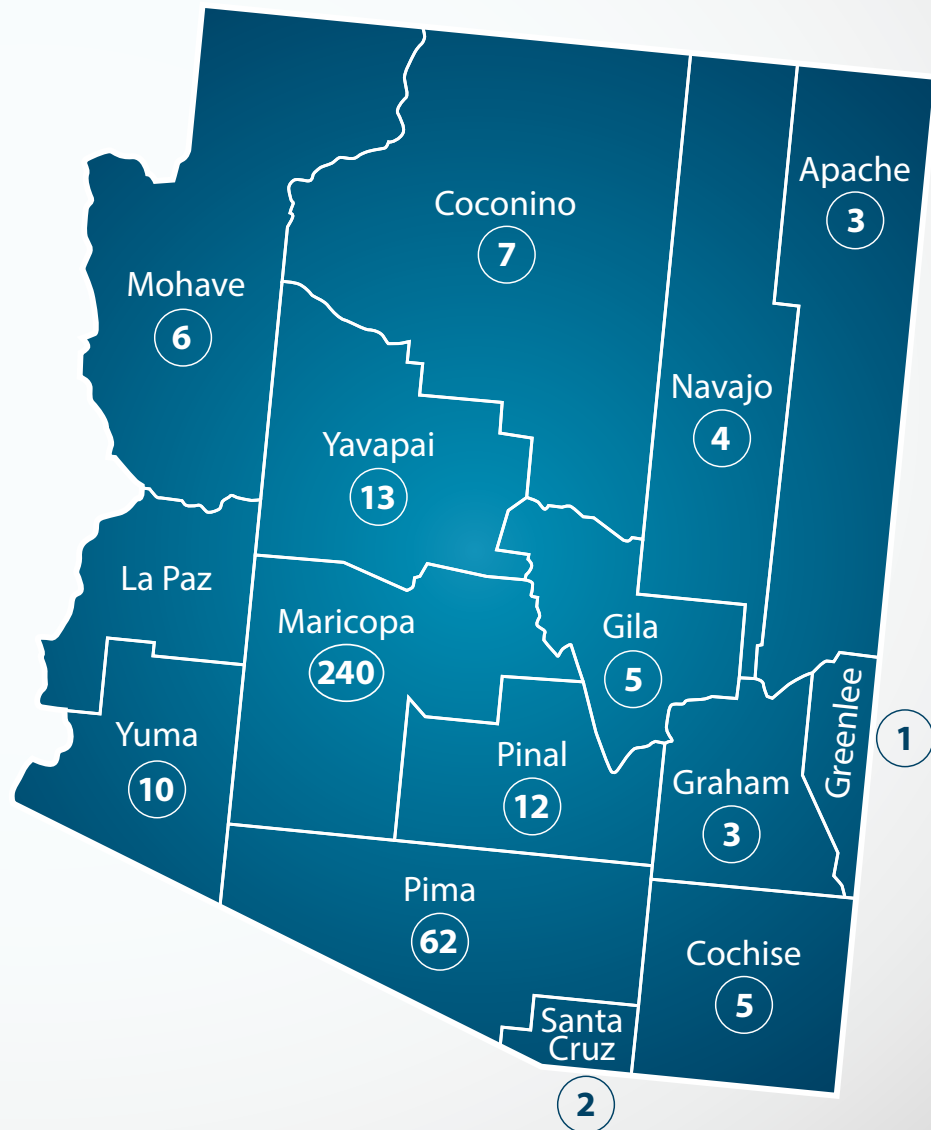

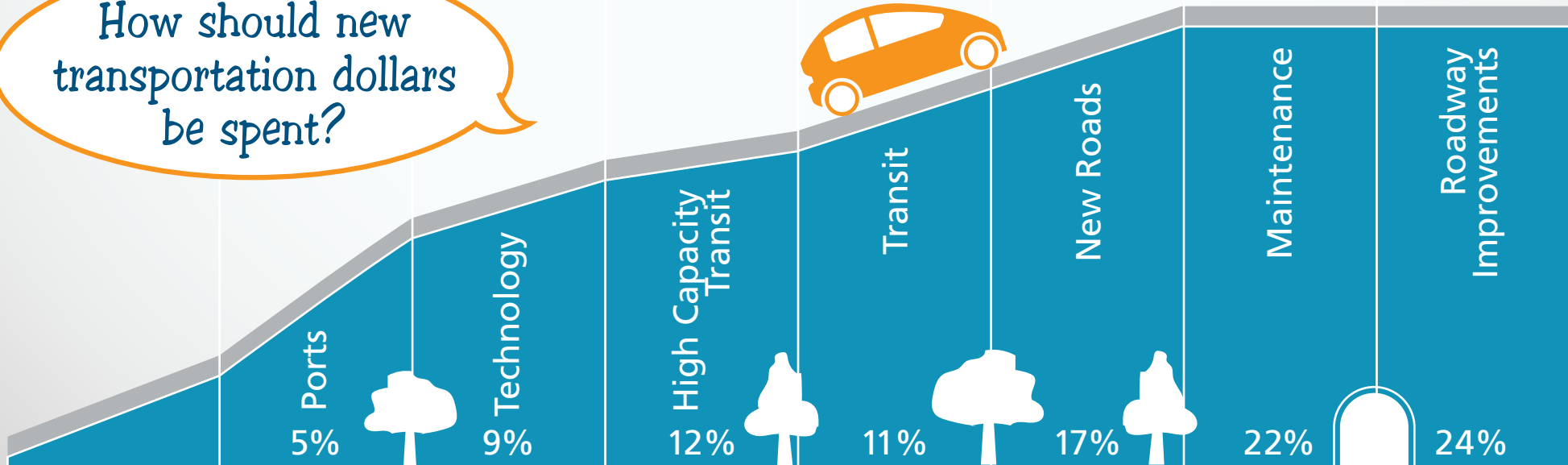

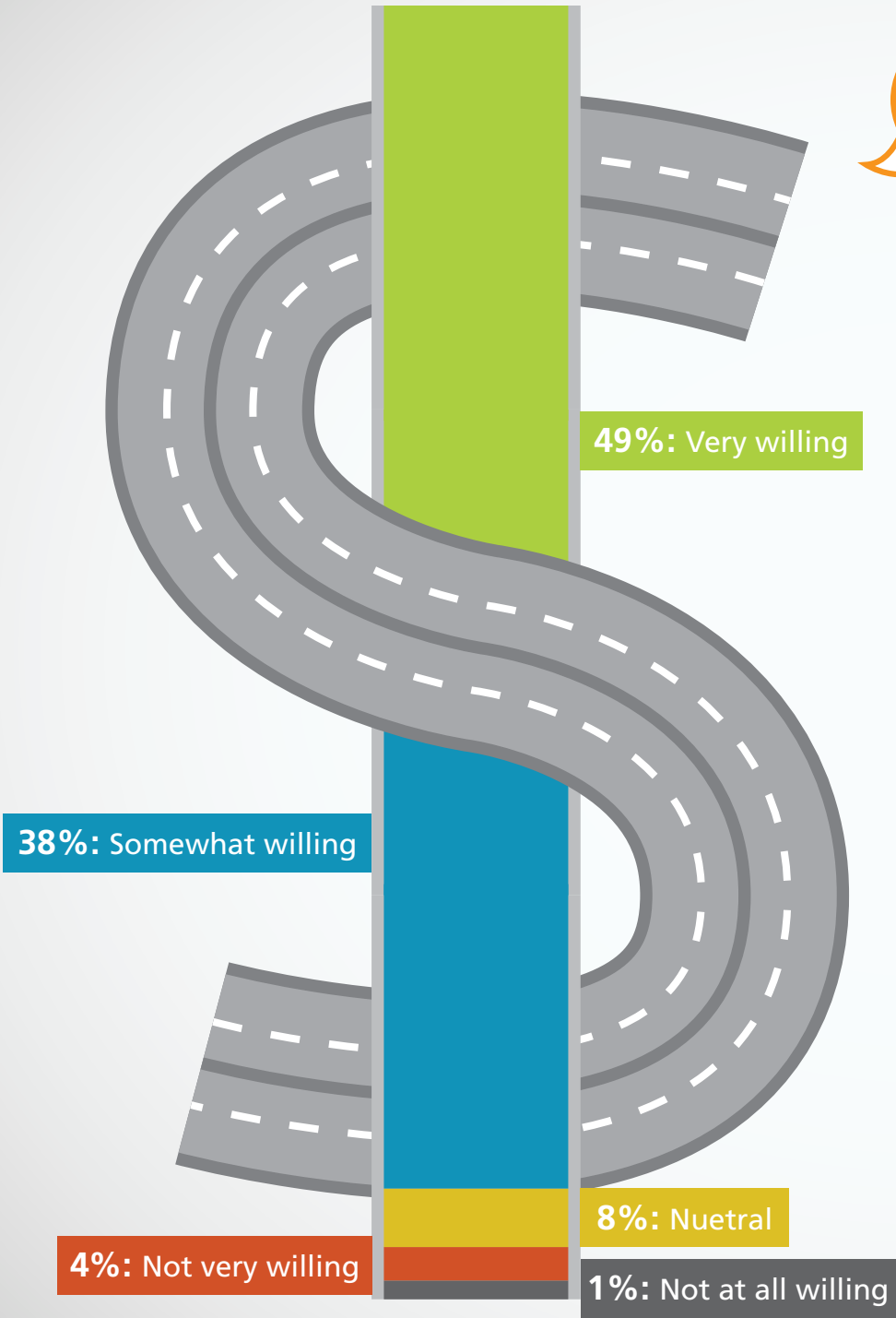
